### **Community Development Block Grants**

The Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) manages the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program on behalf of the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. Area 15 RPC can assist your community with project development for application to the following programs:

#### **Community Facilities and Services:**

This competitive program assists projects such as day care facilities, senior centers, vocational workshops, and storm water projects. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis as funds are available.

#### **Downtown Revitalization Fund:**

This program can be used to rehabilitate blighted downtown buildings to provide economic opportunities for people, especially those of low- and moderate-income. Projects must meet the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Slum and Blight National Objectives.

#### Housing - Upper Story Conversion:

The purpose of this program is to assist communities with the conversion of existing downtown building space into new residential units. Area 15 RPC can assist your community with project development.


#### Water/Sewer:

This competitive program assists cities and counties with projects such as sanitary sewer system improvements, water system improvements, water and wastewater treatment facility projects, storm sewer projects related to sanity sewer system improvements and rural water connections. Application deadlines are January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1.

All CDBG awards, except for the Downtown Revitalization program, are income-level dependent. Contact Brandon Dicks at 641-814-8404 to discuss potential projects in your

Seasonally adjusted unemployment in the Area 15 region was 2.8% for July 2024, down 0.2 percent from a year ago. This change reflected similar pattern shown for the State of Iowa during the same period. "July's report provides evidence of a tightening national economy, consistent with what we are seeing across the country," said Beth Townsend, Executive Director of Iowa Workforce Development. Townsend also reported that Iowa's employers continue to hire, and there are more than 56,000 jobs available at IowaWORKS.gov.

## Homes for lowa



Homes for Iowa, Inc. is a public-private partnership with Iowa Prison Industries. Homes are turn-key 2x6 stick-built construction. Available in 3-bedroom, 2-bath, 1.200sf for \$99,000 delivered or 2-bedroom, 1bath, 1,000sf for \$83,000 delivered. Site work including grading, foundation/basement and utilities are responsibility of developer or homebuyer.

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Jefferson, Keokuk. Mahaska, Marion, Van Buren and Wapello counties. Since inception in 2019, thirteen (13) homes have been delivered to our area. Two (2) of the 13 homes were purchased by homeowners. The remaining 11 homes were purchased by developers. We are currently taking orders for 2025. Please contact Matt at 641-814-8400.

# Iowa DNR Derelict Building Program

The Derelict Building Program provides financial assistance to small communities to improve their attractiveness by removing derelict commercial and public buildings. The program is funded through the Iowa DNR Solid Waste Alternatives Program, projects must have a recycling or reuse component as the intent is to prevent building materials from going to the landfill.

Funding is available for Cities with populations of 5,000 or less to address derelict commercial or public buildings. Cities may use the funding to renovate or deconstruct derelict buildings including inspecting for and removing asbestos. To be eligible: the buildings must be commercial or public buildings that are owned by the city, are not on National Register of Historic Places, and have been vacant for six months or more. To have a successful application: cities should have a plan for reusing the site or building and identified reuse opportunities of the building materials of the derelict structure.
